  stories. Oversaw numerous revisions of the website and mastered new systems over the years.
- Coordinated the newspaper's annual health supplement, developing story ideas, writing and assigning material, taking photographs and laying out the special section.
- Maintained monthly financial records of freelance costs using an Excel spreadsheet, comparing current periods with the previous year as part of the newspaper's cost control measures.
